To see Biblically faithful, Christ-centered, Spirit-filled churches planted in the Midwest

- Churches that are effectively making disciples and having a Kingdom impact in their communities
- Churches that are vibrant, worshipping communities of growing disciples who are engaged in mission.

To see 500 of these PCA churches in the Midwest. If each averaged 200 then it would mean over 100,000 followers of Jesus, 10% of whom we pray will be new believers.

FAST FACTS

- 13 States totaling 71 million which is 21% of the U.S. population (330m)
 - Applying the 15% guideline for the MW = 60,650,000 unchurched.
- 12 cities over 1 million and listed in the top 52 MSA's in the U.S. totaling 36,096,
 000 or 51% of the MW population (compared with 63% in the NE and South).
- 250 churches (217 organized and 33 missions) totally roughly 48,000.
 - Last year: 235 churches (i.e. 204 churches + 31 missions)
- Total mission churches = 16%
- 15 Presbyteries
- There is one PCA church for every 285,000 people (last year: 297,531 (vs. 1 per 175,000 in the NE and 1 per 74,000 in the South in 2018) in 1987 it was 1 per 2 million
 - One church for every 50,000 people would = 1,424 churches
 - One church for every 5,000 people would = 14,249 churches
 - One church for every 500 people would = 142,493 churches
