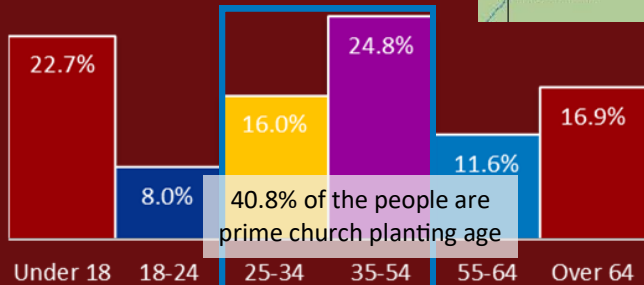


Understanding **Minot, ND** includes knowing that it is a city divided by a river. There is a north hill and a south hill and a river valley in between. Former City Planner and Chief

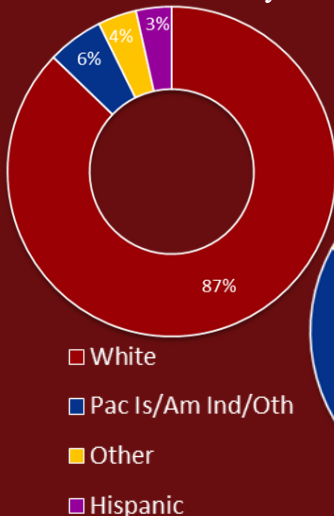

To reach this city with the gospel, the Siouxlands Presbytery is partnering with the Midwest Alliance to plant the first PCA church in Bismarck. With

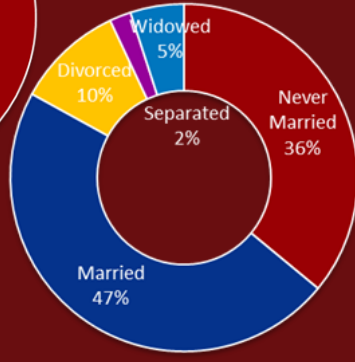


God’s help, the hope is to see this first PCA church in Minot make disciples who will then help to spread the gospel, multiplying praise to God and planting churches throughout the region.

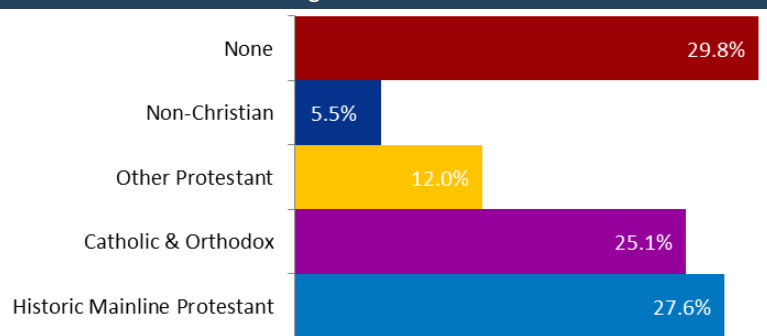
Race/Ethnicity

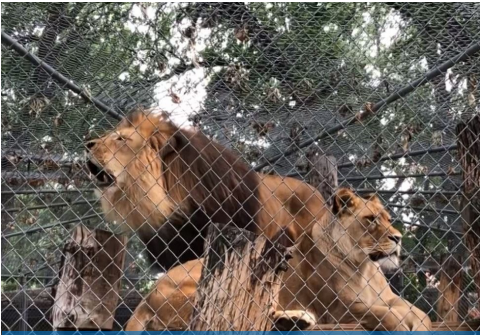


Marital Status



Religious Preferences

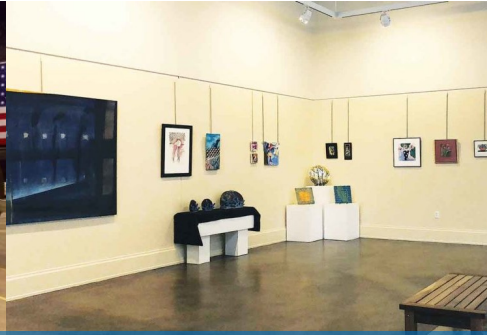
